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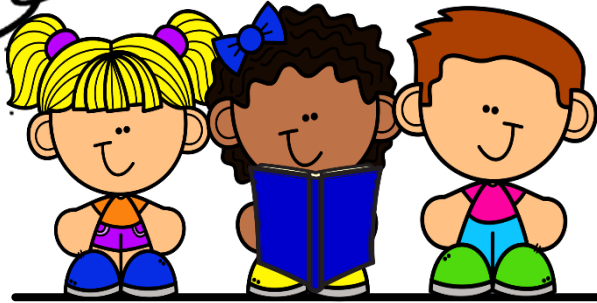
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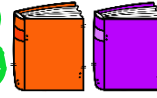
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Help your child begin to understand the difference between fiction and non-fiction text.
